

01 - GENERALITIES

CHARACTERISTICS AND FIELD OF APPLICATION

The new mod. MPC Shirt Folding Machine folds shirts perfectly-ready to be packaged.

An important feature is that the bottom part of the shirt can be folded and automatically inserted inside the shirt itself, which eliminates the need for traditional pins.

Shirts of different sizes (from 38 to 45) can be folded without the need for adjustments, thanks to a device that automatically adjusts to the collar size.

While the shirt is being folded, the shirt collar is also ironed.

The shirt holder board rises vertically before tilting to prevent the collar from getting deformed.

The machine is equipped with a PLC control system.

Output is about 150 to 200 items per hour.

ADVISED USE

The mod. MPC Shirt Folding Machine is **to be used solely** for folding shirts. The manufacturer cannot be held liable for any damage to persons or property arising from the incorrect use of this machine or any use differing from the instructions indicated in this manual.


The symbol indicates there exists a risk or danger for the health of the operator and, therefore, much care must be taken at this point.

The machine is equipped with a shirt collar ironing unit, which usually reaches temperatures near 70°C. Exercise extreme caution when near those parts.


Always disconnect the machine from the mains supply, the compressed air supply and wait for the ironing parts to cool down before undertaking any adjustment, replacement or maintenance work.

The machine must not be exposed to the weather (rain, sun, etc).

02 - SHIRT FOLDING MACHINE mod. MPC TECHNICAL DATA




03 - LIFTING AND TRANSPORTATION



The Shirt Folding Machine mod. MPC can be transported with or without a packing case. In both cases, check that the forks of the fork-lift truck bear the full weight of the machine. To move using a fork-lift truck, place the forks under the machine with the front of the MPC facing the fork-lift truck. Place in the lorry or van and secure with ropes or belts.

04 - LOADING AND UNLOADING



Make sure that the forks of the fork-lift truck bear the full weight of the machine during movement. Remove the packing case and lift the machine with the front facing the fork-lift truck, as in the figure above. Place on a solid and even surface, not exposed to the weather.

05 - INSTALLATION

ATTENTION: This machine must only be installed by specialized personnel.




If the machine is installed on a suspended surface, check that the surface can withstand the weight of the machine. This machine must not be installed in areas where there are explosive or inflammable materials and substances.

For ease of transport, the machine is delivered with the following parts disassembled:


- Shirt holder board "A" (fig. 1). Assemble using the two knobs "B".




- Side cylinder "C" (fig. 2) for automatic folding operation. Assemble using nut "D".




- Iron rest "E" (fig. 3). Attach with screws "F".




- Shelves "G" (fig. 4). Fasten frame "H" to the base and fasten the shelves with screws "I".



- Make sure that the distances shown in figure 5 below are respected as these are necessary for the maintenance and operation of the machine.



- The machine must be placed on a solid and even surface. Turn the nuts "L" (fig. 6) on the leveling feet to adjust the height.



ELECTRICAL CONNECTIONS


The machine is usually delivered with the power cable wired inside the electrical panel. Therefore, all that needs to be done is to connect it to a 220V-50Hz single-phase power outlet.


If this is not the case, proceed as follows:

- Open the electrical panel with the key.
- Pass the power cable through the core hitch on the machine.
- Connect phases "R" and "N" and the earth $\stackrel{\bot}{=}$ to the corresponding terminals of the main switch (fig. 7).
- Before installation, check the efficiency of the earthing system to which the machine is connected.
- The power consumption is 0,4 Kw.




- Connect the machine to the compressed air outlet and make sure that the air flow is sufficient to allow for operation with a constant rate of pressure of 6 Atm.
- Calibrate pressure regulator "M" at between 6 Atm (fig. 8).






06 - MACHINE CONTROLS



TD 200 KEYBOARD FUNCTIONS AND SETTINGS



CONTROL FUNCTION KEYS

To activate a function press the key corresponding to the function. To deactivate a function press the key corresponding to the function.



SETTINGS USING THE KEYBOARD

- 1 Lexan blade return time.
- 2 Collar stretching time.
- 3 Shirt rise time.
- 4 Side cylinder holder slide forward time.
- 5 Side cylinder return time.
- 6 Lexan holder cylinder rise time.

To change the values on the keyboard proceed as follows:

- Press keys and position the cursor on the value to be changed.
- Press key and change the desired value using keys
- After changing the value, press key

SPECIAL OPERATIONS CONTROL

For the special functions proceed as follows:

to activate a function, press the key corresponding to the desired operation; to deactivate it press the key again.

The display shows the operation on or off.

- 1 Key F1 shirt count reset
- 2 Key F2 manual cycle control
- 3 Key F3 automatic or pedal shirt rise control
- 4 Key F4 rear slide forward or slide lock control




07 - OPERATION

START-UP


- Turn on the main switch by turning switch "A" (fig. 1) to the right.
- Turn on the resistances by turning switch "B" (fig. 1) to the right.




- Check that the preset temperature is correct for the particular use. To regulate the temperature (50-60°C) press the keys (fig. 2).
- Wait until the preset temperature is reached on the thermostat.




- Position the shirt and insert the collar into the ironing unit (fig. 3).
- Press the pedal to adjust the ironing unit to the shirt collar and iron the collar.



- Press the pedal again to lower shirt holder board "C" (fig. 4) and to move blades "D" forward. The latter determine the width of the shirt (if "SLIDE YES" has been set with key PHASE (FG)).




- Fold the shirt by hand (fig. 5).



At this point one of 2 different processing cycles take place, depending on the initial setting chosen using key MANUAL CYCLEFFE .

MAN YES = Manual fold operation


MAN NO = Automatic fold operation




AUTOMATIC FOLD OPERATION

- Press the pedal to return the shirt width blades "E" (if "SLIDE YES" has been set with key [SLIDE YES" has been set with key [PHASE [FI]]).


Side cylinder "F" and the cylinder holder carriage for automatic folding move forward (fig. 7).




- Fold the shirt on the board again so that it goes over the cylinder rod for automatic folding (fig. 8).



- Press the pedal or pushbutton "H" (at the operator's discretion) to lower blade "G" (fig. 9), which inserts the fabric inside the shirt (fig. 10);






- After inserting the fabric, the blade comes out; the board rises vertically and then tilts to allow the folded shirt to be removed (if "AUTO YES" has been set with key AUTO PHASE [F]).

If desired, "AUTO NO" may be set so that when the blade comes out, the board stays down to allow for pinning or adjusting the shirt, for example.


When the operation is finished, press the pedal and remove the folded shirt.

The final result is shown in figure 11.



MANUAL FOLDING OPERATION

- Fold the bottom of the shirt (fig. 12).
- Fold the shirt again and pin it.
- Press the pedal again to raise the board and tilt it so that the shirt can be removed.



08 - ADJUSTMENTS




Always disconnect the machine from the mains supply, the compressed air supply and wait for the ironing parts to cool down before undertaking any adjustment, replacement or maintenance work. The operations described below must only be carried out by specialized personnel.

REGULATING COLLAR LOCK PRESSURE

- Increase or decrease the amount of collar lock pressure, by pulling regulator "A" (fig. 1) outwards and turning it in the desired direction.


The pressure value is shown on pressure gage "B" (fig. 1).



ADJUSTING FINISHED SHIRT WIDTH


If different size packages are used, perform the following operations (fig. 2) to set a different shirt width:

- Loosen the two upper knobs "C".
- Adjust the two blades "D" to the desired width, using graduated scale "E".
- Adjust blades "F" to the desired finished width using screws "G".



ADJUSTING THE SHIRT COLLAR

For a more or less elongated collar shape, adjust the position of pin "H" by removing screw "I", moving the pin to a new hole and screwing it in place (fig. 3).



09 - MAINTENANCE



Always disconnect the machine from the mains supply, the compressed air supply and wait for the ironing parts to cool down before undertaking any adjustment, replacement or maintenance work. The operations described below must only be carried out by specialized personnel.


The Shirt Folding Machine mod. MPC does not require any special maintenance during use thanks to its rational design. We recommend following all instructions in this manual very carefully to keep this machine in good and reliable working condition.

REPLACING COLLAR LOCK RESISTANCES

If the collar lock unit does not heat up and the collar is not ironed properly, check that the resistances are working properly, and if necessary, replace them as follows (fig. 1):


- Manually move the motor lock sections apart.
- Disconnect the cable connecting the faulty resistance from the terminal.
- Loosen the corresponding screw "A" on the sections and take out the resistance.
- Insert a new resistance and repeat the operations in reverse order.

On the center section, it may be necessary to disconnect thermal sensor "B".



THERMOSTAT REPLACEMENT

- Remove the faulty thermostat as shown in fig. 2 and insert a new thermostat.



DEMOLITION

In case of machine demolition, separate the different materials making up the machine so that they can be shipped to designated collection sites for re-cycling.

09 - MALFUNCTIONS, CAUSES AND REMEDIES


MALFUNCTION	CAUSE	REMEDY					
Machine does not start	Emergency activated	Deactivate emergency					
	Main switch not on	Turn the switch to the right or check that the main switch inside the electrical panel is in position I.					
	PLC not working	Check that the PLC inside the electrical panel is on.					
	Faulty fuses	Check that the fuses inside the electrical panel are good.					
	Lack of pressure	Check the pneumatic system pressure					
	Limit switches I 0.2 (blade low) and I 0.4 (folding cylinder at rest) not working or in wrong position	Check that the limit switches are working properly. Adjust their position so that the corresponding LED lights up when the cylinder is at the end of the run. Check that the signal arrives at the PLC.					
The shirt holder board does not go down completely	Limit switch I 0.3 (blade high) not working properly or in wrong position	Check that the limit switches are working properly. Adjust their position so that the corresponding LED lights up when the cylinder is at the end of the run. Check that the signal arrives at the PLC.					
Collar lock unit does not heat up	Burned out resistance	Replace (see page 18). Check that current reaches the terminal and that there is continuity in the resistances.					
	Faulty thermostat	Replace (see page 18).					
	Faulty thermal sensor	Check and/or replace					
	Faulty remote control switch	Check with tester and/or replace.					
Shirt collar not ironed properly	Temperature too low	Increase temperature (see page 12).					
	Collar lock pressure too low	Regulate the collar lock unit pressure (see page 17).					




For prompt part identification, the following data must be provided:


- 1. Machine model and serial number

- 3. Sheet in which the spare part is shown


